

Assistant Professor – Sport Management

The Sport Management Program at the University of Michigan invites applications and nominations for one, possibly two Assistant level tenure-track positions. Preference will be given to candidates whose research and teaching interests are interdisciplinary. Teaching and research interests in the areas of organizational theory and behavior, human resource management, entrepreneurship, international marketing/management, management science/ decision management, strategic marketing/management and law/public policy will be considered. The preferred start date is fall 2010.

Beginning assistant professor candidates should have a record of publication and more advanced candidates should have outstanding publication records in leading journals in sport management and business. Candidates must possess an earned doctorate in a related field before employment. Candidates will be expected to maintain an active research agenda, teach undergraduate and graduate courses, and have research methods and statistical expertise appropriate for the effective mentoring of student research at the master's and doctoral levels. Candidates must demonstrate the ability to acquire private and/or public funds to support their research.

The Sport Management Program prides itself on research productivity and teaching excellence. The Program maintains collaborative relationships with other academic units across the University of Michigan as well as with organizations in the sport industry.
