

2022 KidSport Summer Camp Scholarship Information

The KidSport Summer Camp Scholarship is designed to assist families with children ages 4-12 meet the cost of the KidSport Summer Camp program. It is available to any parent or legal guardian wishing to enroll their child in the KidSport Summer Camps. Scholarships are awarded based on the evaluation of the information that is requested. Scholarship requests with incomplete or missing information will NOT be processed/considered. This year, the scholarship will cover \$50 off a session, and is limited to one session per child.

Scholarship Policies

Need-based scholarships are available for KidSport Summer Camps only. The number of scholarships awarded is dependent upon the amount of money available, which varies year-to-year. Scholarship eligibility is contingent upon camp attendance. Scholarships are good for 2022 KidSport Summer Camps only. All scholarship documentation will be kept confidential. Documentation listed below MUST be provided in order to be considered for a KidSport Summer Camps Scholarship:

1. Completed registration on Camp Doc.
2. Free/Reduced Lunch verification letter uploaded on Camp Doc. If you do not wish to upload the document, you may also mail it to the address listed below.
3. If you do not have a free/reduced lunch verification letter, documented income/support that falls within the “very low” or “low” HUD income guidelines for 2021 may be submitted by providing a copy of the current year tax forms and two current pay checks. Alternative or additional documentation may be required, upon request.
