

DOCTORAL ANNOUNCEMENT FOR FALL 2024

Dr. Angela Fong, Assistant Professor in the School of Kinesiology at the University of Michigan, is currently seeking a motivated Doctoral Student to work on research related to exercise behavior promotion, dissemination and implementation science, and health disparities among women diagnosed with cancer from historically marginalized backgrounds starting **Fall 2024**.

Research Projects:

The admitted student will have the opportunity to work on projects related to:

- Culturally tailoring exercise interventions for Black breast cancer survivors.
- Identifying and examining psychosocial determinants and outcomes of online-delivered exercise interventions among rural women diagnosed with cancer.
- Identifying optimized intervention strategies to promote exercise and nutrition behaviors among endometrial cancer survivors.

Funding Details:

Students will need to apply and gain admittance to the University of Michigan School of Kinesiology doctoral program. The admitted student will be provided with full funding for tuition, stipend, and health care (for them and immediate family) as a Graduate Student Instructor.

Preferred Applicant Qualifications:

- Master's and Bachelor's degrees in Kinesiology, Exercise Science, Public Health, Psychology, or other health-related fields.
- Previous experience in research with human subjects, publications, and a high GPA from previous academic work are highly desirable.
