



2025 KidSport Summer Camps Scholarship Information

The KidSport Summer Camp Scholarship is to assist families with children ages 4-11 meet the cost of the KidSport Summer Camp program. It is available to any parent or legal guardian wishing to enroll their child in KidSport Summer Camps. Scholarships are awarded based on the evaluation of the information submitted. Scholarship requests with incomplete or missing information will **NOT** be processed/considered.

Scholarship Policies

Need-based scholarships are available for KidSport Summer Camps only. The number of scholarships awarded is dependent upon the amount of money available, which varies year-to-year. Scholarship eligibility is contingent upon camp attendance. Scholarships are good for 2025 KidSport Summer Camps only. All scholarship documentation will be kept confidential. **Documentation listed below MUST be provided to be considered for a KidSport Summer Camps Scholarship:**

1. Education Benefits letter from school district for the 2024-2025 school year stating your child is eligible for Education Benefits (Formerly referred to as free/reduce lunch form).
2. Documented income/support that falls within the “very low” or “extremely low” HUD income guidelines for 2024 may be submitted by providing a copy of your 2024 tax forms and two current pay checks. Alternative or additional documentation may be required, upon request. *Please also state the number of people in your family.*

- Complete registration on Camp Doc and pay the registration fee of \$25 for half days or \$50 for full days

***Your application will NOT be processed/considered for a scholarship if required information is incomplete or missing.**

***If you are requesting scholarships for more than one child, separate documentation is required for each child.**
