

2026 KidSport Summer Camps Scholarship Information

The KidSport Summer Camp Scholarship is to assist families with children ages 4-11 meet the cost of the KidSport Summer Camp program. It is available to any parent or legal guardian wishing to enroll their child in KidSport Summer Camps. Need-based scholarships are awarded based on the evaluation of the information submitted. Each year we have a limited number of scholarships that can be awarded based on funding.

Scholarship Policies & Procedures

Need-based scholarships are available for KidSport Summer Camps. The number of scholarships awarded is dependent upon the amount of money available, which varies year-to-year. Scholarship eligibility is contingent upon camp attendance. Scholarships are good for 2026 KidSport Summer Camps only. All scholarship documentation will be kept confidential. **Financial, need-based documentation from the family MUST be provided to be considered for a KidSport Summer Camps Scholarship.** Please submit **your choice** of supporting financial need documentation.

Scholarship Procedure:

1. Register your child in CampDoc and pay the registration fee of \$25 for half days or \$50 for full days.
2. After registering, upload into CampDoc or mail required documentation. Mailing address is below.
3. Applications will be reviewed in order of submission once steps 1 and 2 are completed.
4. KidSport staff will notify recipients via email.

*If you are requesting scholarships for more than one child, separate documentation is required for each child.
