



Announcement for Doctoral Student Assistantship

Dr. Leah E. Robinson, professor and director of the [Child Movement, Activity & Developmental Health \(CMAH\) Lab](#) in the School of Kinesiology at the University of Michigan, is currently seeking a motivated doctoral student to work on research that takes a developmental perspective to motor skill acquisition, physical activity, and physical health and development starting in fall 2027.

Faculty Bio and Research Focus

Dr. Robinson's research focuses on advancing the understanding of how children develop motor competence and confidence, which are essential for leading healthy, active lives. She has secured over \$ 24 million in extramural funding as a Principal Investigator from the National Institutes of Health, the Department of Education, the American Diabetes Association, Meta Platforms, and others. The student will research motor skills, physical activity, and developmental health outcomes in children and youth, with potential expansion to movement in aging populations.

Assistantship Information

This graduate assistantship offers a stipend, tuition support, and healthcare for the fall, winter, and spring/summer terms. It is renewable for three subsequent years, contingent upon satisfactory performance, for a total of four years of funding. **Applications open on September 1, 2026, and are accepted on a rolling basis until December 1, 2026.**

Preferred Applicant's Experience and Qualifications

To be considered for the position, you will need: 1) a master's degree in kinesiology, exercise science, public health, or other movement/health-related field, and 2) competitive GPA in previous academic work. Previous research or teaching experience, and/or publications in motor development, physical activity, or related areas, as well as prior experience in motor and physical activity assessments, are highly desirable. **The ideal candidate should have strong analytical and problem-solving skills, thrive in both team and individual environments, have strong organizational and communication skills, and maintain a high degree of accountability.** Please email the following documents (cover letter stating your research interests, goals, and previous experiences, current CV, writing samples, and contact information of 3 references) in a single combined PDF to lerobin@umich.edu with the subject line "PhD position fall 2027."
